

CONSCIOUS COLLEGE ROAD TOUR 2016 RECAP









The 5th Annual Conscious College Road Tour visited 16 college and university campuses nationwide from March 20 through May 4. The tour is a unique, interactive, hands-on opportunity for students to become informed about the benefits and accessibility of conscious living. This 6-week fly/drive journey is designed to inform, inspire, and mobilize students around conscious living.

WHO'S INVOLVED?

The Turning Green team, Campus Reps and student volunteers at each school along with the thousands of students, faculty, and staff participants at each school visit.

WHAT HAPPENS AT EACH STOP?

There are two components.

The Conscious Information Station focuses on six lifestyle themes relevant to college students including; food, body, style, zero waste, clean, and space. The interactive set-up features info boards, sampling, hands-on demos, activities, and in-depth conversations.











HOW LIKELY ARE YOU TO TELL A FRIEND SOMETHING YOU LEARNED TODAY?

OUTCOMES

A key goal of the CCRT each year is to source ideas from students about sustainability projects they would like to lead on their campuses. TG then works across campuses to co-develop these ideas and bring like-minded student leaders together. During the summer, we finalize these visions as part of our Leadership Development Program. The projects are then designed as toolkits and shared with the Turning Green collective of schools.

#BRING BACK THE BEES

A school initiative aimed at protecting student health and campus environments by working to eliminate pesticides and herbicides from commons, gardens and open spaces. This project will be developed and implemented with students from multiple campuses and in collaboration with TG, Friends of the Earth and Center for Food Safety.

THE FRESHMAN PROJECT (TFP)

Through a lens of sustainability, this project aims to engage interested first year students in thoughtful practices, actions and mindset. A TFP toolkit can be utilized by student leaders and will include a full compendium of resources, activities, and next steps while prompting leaders to start TG Chapters on campus to support their efforts. We believe that if freshman are engaged early on, they will envision their campuses as a palette for sustainable change throughout their college careers.
